Overview of reports from BOD meeting Tuesday evening:

• Youth Activities

Ben Berlinger, Youth Activities Chair

- Handed out report of the student activities from this year.
- Our section has an active youth activities committee, listed in report, thank you to all those committee members.
 - We wanted to bring your attention to our FFA work, primarily on the eastern part of the state, but want to involve more FFA Range Judging and Plant Id competitions in the western part of state. IF there is something our committee can do to expand our involvement over here, we'd be happy to do that.
 - \circ $\,$ Monica Klingler is a member of the committee here on the western slope.
 - Please let our committee members know If we can help you. One thing we can do to help you with it is the 3rd edition of Range and Pasture Management Book \$28 plus shipping. It's an A to Z approach to teaching a range curriculum for Ag or Environmental teachers or download free of charge a PDF version, Emmet Jordon one of our ranchers on the eastern part of the state did the graphic design free of charge.
 - We had two regional competitions this year, NE and SE Colorado as well as a state competition with 276 students and 25 FFA chapters, a record for us.
 - We've received recognition our participation at the FFA & Camp Rocky as well as media coverage
- Camp Rocky is another event we've been involved with High School Conservation Camp, our section presents awards for the range management section with an SRM belt buckle that went to Breanna Etl this year.

• Investments

Lana Pearson, Treasurer for Joe Brummer, Investment Chair

- Two main accounts: an investment holding account with a current balance of \$113,541 (much of this resulted from the 2010 SRM meeting CSSRM hosted). and the CSU endowment fund with a current balance of \$40,988.01 (used for CSU student travel to SRM meetings).
- If we need to, we can dip into our investments account if we need more money for our operating budget. We get money from our meetings, and \$5/person from SRM for each member. Our operating budget does need to be backed up occasionally from our investment account.

CSU Student Affairs/Scholarships Paul Meiman, University Student Affairs Chair

- Got involved with SRM as an undergrad in 1991, has been a member ever since because of their great support of students.
- Record turnout of students at a section meeting
- Also held Plant ID and URME exams at this meeting
 - \circ $\,$ 10 students from CSU and SUU (Southern Utah University) competed in Plant ID $\,$
 - \circ $\;$ All students from CSU and SUU took the URME $\;$
- At CSU we've repackaged our Range and Forestry curriculum, and Forest and Rangeland Stewardship has a new offering of a Restoration Ecology Major which is very similar to the old Rangeland major with a restoration concentration. Our annual report to SRM updated them and for the time being the two range concentrations and the new restoration major have SRM accreditation.
- For the first time, the college commencement speaker is a range major
- Troy Ocheltree, new range faculty member, was recommended by Paul M. and Hailey Wilmer for the early career award from SRM
- CSSRM sponsors two \$1000 scholarships for students studying range; one to a
 - freshman/sophomore/recent transfer student and one junior/senior student. This year's awardees are:
 - Lee Goertznowsky Recent transfer student, came from Kansas

- Sarah LeVane Senior, CSU Range Club President this year and secretary last year
- We had \$500 from last spring which we are awarding to Cody Mortell, a senior and CSU Range Club Treasurer
- We have a really strong officer team, Thanks CSSRM for sponsoring student scholarships.
